#### Introduction

The Social Sciences Review Panel consisting of Dr. John Johannes, Villanova University, and Dr. John Pauly, Provost, Marquette University, communicated via e-mail and phone during February 2012 to evaluate twenty-eight (28) proposals submitted to the Louisiana Board of Regents requesting funds through the Traditional Enhancement component of the Boards of Regents Support Fund.

The panel received the following materials prior to the review: (1) all proposals and appropriate rating forms; (2) a summary of the proposals submitted listing titles, PIs, their institutions, and funds requested; (3) a copy of the most recent Social Sciences report (FY 2008-09); and (4) the FY 2011-12 Traditional and Undergraduate Enhancement Request for Proposals containing criteria for evaluation. After studying all proposals, the panel communicated via e-mail and phone to review and rank them. During the review process each proposal was discussed individually and its merits were evaluated with respect to criteria detailed in the RFP. Each proposal received a thorough and impartial review. Subsequent to the individual evaluations, the panel ranked all proposals and recommended funding levels for those deemed worthy of funding.

The twenty-eight (28) Social Sciences proposals submitted in FY 2011-12 requested a total of \$2,285,789 in first-year funds. Five (5) proposals were highly recommended for funding, two (2) of them at reduced levels.

Table I contains a rank-order list of proposals highly recommended for funding, together with the recommended funding levels. Table II contains a list of proposals recommended for funding if additional monies become available. Table III contains a list of proposals not recommended for funding. A detailed review of each proposal follows immediately after the tables. A summary of all proposals submitted (Appendix A) and a copy of the rating forms used in the evaluations (Appendix B) are attached at the end of the report.

The goal of this project, to create a curriculum that promotes global understanding, is sound, and BPCC is to be congratulated for attempting to move in this direction. However, the projected outcome of this proposal is somewhat exaggerated, and the plan to yield the desired outcome is vague. Many of the elements of the work plan could have already been accomplished and appear to consist of "planning to plan". It should not require an outside expert or travel to a conference to design a world-diversity curriculum. Selecting or creating courses involving non-American content is not difficult to do, nor is it hard to point students to global online resources. The proposal assumes that taking several courses will make a marked difference in training a "globally aware" workforce. The institutional match is very strong, yet these funds alone, perhaps allocated differently, would get the project moving and possibly completed. Overall, this is an interesting and good project, but one that does not require Enhancement funding. Funding is not recommended.

The proposal requests equipment to enhance education in film and television production. While it is clear that this is a growing and vital aspect of the regional economy, it is unclear exactly what the proposal intends to accomplish, why it needs to be done, what the intended outcomes and evaluation measures will be, what the student or faculty benefits will be, or what linkages to the community or industry have been sought. Funding is not recommended.

The proposal requests equipment for educational enhancement in the Communication Studies program. It is, fundamentally, an experiment in the use of iPads, and represents a reasonable but not convincing proposal. The proposed use of the iPads to improve learning, collaboration, and efficiency is plausible, but the argument is often general and not entirely persuasive. What precisely does the proposed equipment provide that existing computers do not? Student surveys and "reflections" are weak tools to assess programmatic success. There is little evidence that the PI has investigated what other universities and colleges have done with iPads and built that information into the plan and curriculum. Explanation of the camcorders and tripods is minimal, but plausible. Purchase of SPSS and Dreamweaver software makes very good sense. However, should not SPSS be a University-licensed tool? Listing the existing Mac lab as institutional matching is misleading. The description of personnel costs lacks details. Funding is not recommended.

The proposal seeks to organize and promote the Disaster Science and Management internship program. The value of the program is clear, as is the appropriateness of such a university-based program in Louisiana. Expanding the number of internships seems appropriate, but the description of the actual work involved in doing so could have been more explicit. It is not clear if there are reasons to believe that 16 new internship sites could be added, and what the expansion would entail. Three months of faculty support appears excessive, and the travel expenses appear high and are poorly justified. It is unclear what the faculty support means in terms of release from teaching duties. It is also unclear why workstudy funds (presumably already available) or funding from the University are not used to hire the student worker, at least during the school year. There is no institutional match. Despite these criticisms, the program is important, the project appears to be worthy overall, and the cost is modest. Partial funding is recommended if additional monies become available with budget reductions made at the discretion of the PI.

This is essentially an exploratory proposal designed to salvage/upgrade a small Master's program by adding a health communication focus and distance-learning strategies. The focus on health communication is sensible, and the proposal clearly demonstrates the potential importance of the initiative. However, the project seems excessively expensive to enhance three or four courses and recruit/train a small number of students. Much of the work described in the proposal should be the normal work of curriculum and enrollment planning. The importance and function of the distance-learning component is not well explained. No evidence of student demand is provided. The requested travel support appears excessive. There is no discussion of possible assistance from or cooperation with other University units for undertaking distance-learning initiatives. The requested equipment and supplies are inadequately justified and seem to be "add-ons." The need for all of the consultants is unclear. Funding is not recommended.

This proposal to establish a research program on inequality and social well-being is an interesting and commendable project. It is within the abilities of the faculty. The suggested linkages among inequality, health, and economic development are either obvious, already documented, or, in a few cases, slightly exaggerated. Most neighborhoods are likely already well known in terms of overall fitness for economic development. There are some questions about the utility of the one-time survey. Is there certainty that phone surveys will pick up a true sample of the target population, especially in very poor neighborhoods? The work plan is very ambitious, and it is not clear that the project can be accomplished in 13 months. It is also not clear why five new graduate students are required. The proposed budget is very high relative to available funds, and it cannot be appropriately reduced. Funding is not recommended.

This clear and reasonable proposal to acquire equipment for archaeological education and research is a worthwhile initiative. For a relatively modest cost the new equipment would significantly deepen and strengthen the work of several archaeology faculty and their students (though there is some question about the utility for a large group of students). The faculty have already tested the equipment and have a specific sense of how it will improve their work. The funding for the field trips is an "add-on" to this proposal, and such funding ought to come from other sources. One negative is the absence of any matching funds. Partial funding is recommended with no funding recommended for field trips. Other reductions are to be made at the discretion of the PI.

This request for upgraded equipment in the Computer Aided Design lab for apparel design education is a worthwhile proposal. It is reasonably well described. The requested equipment builds upon a clear departmental strength. The proposal makes a strong case for the importance of apparel education to the Louisiana economy. The budget contains a computer upgrade and some routine supply costs, which should presumably be covered by internal funding. The preliminary work with Lectra should already have been done. The benchmarks, goals, and methods of assessment could have been clearer. There is no institutional match. Though the project is sound, the cost is prohibitively high considering the limited funds available, and it is less compelling than other worthy projects. Funding is not recommended.

This proposal to build a digital collection of materials relating to waterways and flood control in the lower Mississippi Valley is well written and carefully argued with potential for great value for the University and the State. The proposal is straightforward and includes clear goals and benchmarks for assessing results. It is surprising that sources for purchase of hardware have not already been identified. The absence of any cost sharing or matching weakens the proposal. Due to limited funding resources, partial funding is recommended, with no funding for graduate students. Further reductions are to be made at the discretion of the PI.

This proposal to improve instruction for television production techniques in the Electronic Media Journalism Program is, overall, sound and worthwhile, but there are questions. Some of the claims about the importance of studio production require more support and context. To produce a polished, professional product that represents the wider campus and provides opportunities for students, some amount of controlled, high-end studio work will be necessary. However, that is not the professional world in which most communication students are going to find employment. Digital media have put most of the tools of storytelling on the desktop. How many students would be involved and take advantage of this project? What precisely are the performance and assessment measures? Paying stipends is questionable. Would the need for stipends be alleviated if some modest course credit were given? What will happen when the year's stipends are depleted? Neither of the PIs seems to have much experience in this area. Funding is not recommended.

This proposal to technologically enhance instruction in Family and Child Studies does not explain the purposes and uses of requested equipment with enough specificity to know what the outcomes of this initiative would be. It is not clear how the ability to produce a video will make students better family life educators, or what the nature of the videos would be. How many students will participate? What is the linkage between video production and subsequent professional competence? The proposal underestimates the amount of training and expertise needed to produce credible-looking video materials. It is not clear that students would be capable of producing high-quality videos useful for teaching in K-12 schools. The claim that this technology will facilitate faculty research is not well supported. The evaluation measures are heavily quantitative, yielding little or no information about student learning enhancement. It is not clear if the PI has experience with video production or if competing State programs use this equipment. Funding is not recommended.

This should be part of the everyday work of the two Pls. The outcomes assessment and evaluation are weakly stated. It is not clear how the Pls will know if this technology has enhanced student learning. Overall, this is a worthy proposal, and full funding is recommended.

It is also unclear why iPads are needed to access statistical data. Will there be any problems mixing and matching PC with Apple hardware? Do the PIs have experience with this equipment? According to the enhancement plan, faculty members have not yet been asked to consider what videos they will use in conjunction with this project. The institutional match is impressive, but funding is not recommended.

The software improvements described are certainly desirable and, to some extent, becoming more necessary in all programs. The inkind contribution described was for a previous equipment investment rather than new money toward this improvement. Detail is lacking on exactly how the new software will be used and what the outcome will be. Funding is not recommended.

It is not clear how the workshop will stimulate or support faculty research. Descriptions of outcomes and evaluation measures are weak. There are multiple syntactical and grammatical errors in the writing. Funding is not recommended.

While the proposal is a worthy investment, due to limited funds only partial funding is recommended if additional monies become available, with all budget reductions made at the discretion of the PI.

This proposal to create a Certificate Program in Family Practice for Master's students is worthy and contains strong support letters, but is vague with respect to details. Can the Porter Cason Institute sustain this effort past the life of the grant? It is assumed that preliminary work has been done, e.g., surveying faculty, checking existing syllabi, surveying potential clinicians who might supervise students, and making connections with agencies. What if the School of Social Work cannot recruit sufficient numbers for the program? The need for three outside speakers is not made clear. The cost matching arrangements are strong. The proposal is poorly written in places, lacking clarity and focus. It is difficult to find answers to straightforward questions. For example, how much of what sort of work does the certificate require? The budget description is confusing. The comparison of what the potential award would fund and what the program is willing to continue to fund later is confusing. Partial funding is recommended if additional monies become available. Budget reductions can be made at the discretion of the PI, and the institutional match may be reduced proportionately.

This proposal for a long-term study of regional Native American sites makes a decent case for the historic and intellectual significance of the area the researchers wish to study. More details could be provided describing what the researchers intend to do and how the work depends upon the requested resources. A significant amount of equipment is requested with explanations of what each instrument does, but without much overall context about how the pieces fit together or why they are all necessary at once. It was not clear how much equipment the program already has, or why all of the new equipment is needed. There is little explanation of what sorts of work would occur in each year. It is an interesting and probably worthwhile project, but the cost is prohibitive given the limited funds available and other, more competitive proposals.

The institution's willingness to contribute heavily to the project is impressive. This is a worthwhile undertaking. However, with limited funds available and no clear sense of the project's potential impact, no funding is recommended.

The proposal builds on a steady series of improvements in the past. It is not clear how the new equipment will be incorporated into the curriculum. The proposal did not adequately describe what the new equipment will do that the current equipment does not, and how that will make a difference in students' experiences. Which other architecture programs in the State and nearby have this technology? The equipment cost listed in the narrative does not match the cost listed in the budget justification. The institutional match is for time and indirect costs only. Due to the limited amount of funds available and the relatively high cost of the proposal, funding is not recommended.

The proposal to create an educational iPad application is an imaginative approach to teaching architectural design and offers a clear timeline for development. The school does have expertise in game development, although this is not made apparent until late in the narrative. The hiring of a programmer to develop the game is treated too briefly and casually. The budget is relatively costly compared to available funds. Given how much of the request is for salaries, it is hard to imagine how costs could be reduced and still make the project viable. The proposal could have argued more assertively why this project is absolutely necessary to develop this application. It is rife with technical jargon and certain parts are hard to follow. It is not clear that this approach is the best way to achieve the project's ultimate goals. Funding is not recommended.

These online journals should be available through the library as standard practice, so requesting purchase in this proposal is puzzling. There should be a statewide plan for these resources. It is not clear if there is a plan to renew the three-year agreements. It is impossible to judge the impact of the project without more information. Which journals are needed for undergraduate instruction? Which of them are available online and in hard copy now? How many students would be affected? The assessment and evaluation plans are weak. Funding is not recommended.

This well-written proposal for various departmental enhancements to improve recruiting and retention argues for improved educational spaces such as labs and Smart classrooms that are standard in most communication and media programs. It is a solid project, but its expectations and proposed results appear to be somewhat exaggerated. The emphasis on recruitment rather than pedagogy and student learning weakens the proposal. The speakers and workshops appear to be less crucial and might be funded through internal or private sources. Details about connections to industry lack specifics. A portion of the work plan should already have been undertaken and even finished prior to proposal submission (e.g., assessing inventories, planning for speakers, developing assessment tools for this project). Funding is not recommended.

The proposal requests funds to acquire equipment that will complete a series of major enhancements to high-tech film production education at UNO. It represents a significant investment in a highly successful program that has had economic benefits for the New Orleans region. The faculty expertise is clearly documented, and strong rationales for the technology improvements are offered. The project enables an ambitious transition from only being able to show 4K films to enabing students to make them. The institutional match is impressive. Full funding is recommended.

This is an ambitious proposal to bolster the launch of a new Communications Studies major with various enhancements, including the acquisition of educational technology, curricular development, and an international exchange program. The new major is a noble and potentially exciting initiative, but the link between the pedagogical goals and the list of requested equipment is tenuous. Many of the goals can be met with minimal or no equipment. The project components do not fit together in a convincing fashion, especially at this level of requested funding. Strong aspects include the mission-related goals of the project, the proposed Community Advisory Board to create a civic engagement strategy, and the faculty-student collaboration. The need for some equipment is apparent, but the connection of that need to the proposal rationale is not. The number of students to be served is small. The service learning in Haiti is notable, but does not seem essential at this early stage. The proposal might have been stronger if it focused on support for the pedagogical enhancements rather than equipment. It is not clear why all three Communications programs cannot share lab resources and equipment. It is also not clear whether the proposed lab will be open and properly staffed during non-class hours, which would greatly add to its utility. It is surprising that a new major would be launched without adequate equipment and supporting services. Funding is not recommended.
