#### II. IMPORTANT DEADLINES

A. <u>Deadline for Research & Development (RCS and ITRS) Notices of Intent:</u> Wednesday, September 11, 2013

Applicants who wish to submit proposals under either of the Research and Development Subprograms (Research Competitiveness or Industrial Ties Research) <u>must first submit a notice of intent</u> in accordance with the guidelines in the R&D RFP.

B. <u>Deadline for Awards to Louisiana Artists and Scholars (ATLAS) Notices of</u> Intent: **Thursday, October 10, 2013** 

Applicants who wish to submit proposals under the ATLAS Program <u>must first</u> <u>submit a notice of intent</u> in accordance with the guidelines in the ATLAS RFP.

C. Deadline for Asking Questions about these RFPs: **Tuesday, October 15, 2013** 

In accordance with R.S. 39:1503, a deadline of October 15, 2013 has been established for receipt of questions related to these RFPs. After this date, no further inquiries can be accepted. All questions posed and answers provided by Board staff will be posted on the Sponsored Programs website as soon as possible after the deadline. Operating in this manner ensures that all potential applicants receive the same information.

### III. IMPORTANT NOTICES

A. <u>Traditional and Undergraduate Enhancement RFP</u>: Please note that scoring of proposal components for both Primarily Equipment and Primarily Non-Equipment submissions has been adjusted to reflect the growing importance of project evaluation and assessment.

- B. <u>Availability of LOGAN Notice of Intent/Proposal Submission Modules</u>: LOGAN submission modules for all affected programs will be available no later than Monday, August 5, 2013. Potential applicants should consult the appropriate RFP(s) for instructions to access the system.
- C. Graduate Fellows, Research & Development, and Enhancement RFPs: At its May 22, 1997, meeting, the Board of Regents reaffirmed its commitment to the reform of undergraduate education and teacher preparation and encouraged all Support Fund program applicants to consider these priorities as they develop proposals. Board staff will make all external reviewers aware of the Board's commitment to undergraduate reform and teacher preparation. Reviewers will be instructed that, when all else is equal, preference should be given to those proposals which emphasize, in a meaningful manner, reform-based undergraduate education and teacher preparation.
- D. Graduate Fellows RFPs: Relative to the Graduate Fellows Program, the Board would like to emphasize again this year that both the Board of Regents Support Fund Long-Range Strategic Plan for Higher Education, as well as the RFP, establish the eligibility of master's-level degree programs of critical importance to the State's economic development and diversification. Moreover, in January 1993, the Board of Regents established a 20% set-aside program designated the "Board of Regents Support Fund Graduate Fellowships for Teachers" (GFT) Program. This one-year, master's-level fellowship program targets teachers in disciplinary areas important to Louisiana's economic development. Applicants should note, however, that participation in the GFT is limited to mathematics and science disciplines only. Applicants for master's-level awards in either the Traditional Graduate Fellows Program or the GFT Program should keep in mind that the burden of proof is on them to develop a persuasive and compelling case for why their proposals are of critical importance to Louisiana's economic development and diversification.

# E. Research & Development RFP:

1. RCS and ITRS Applicants

All equipment requests under the R&D program must show, on the appropriate budget page(s), a 25% or greater cash match. For RCS proposals, the required equipment match must be provided by the applicant's employing institution.

2. ITRS Applicants ONLY

At the time of proposal submission, all ITRS applicants are required to have a matching commitment in writing from the private/federal sector for at least the first year of the request. A plan to secure subsequent year matching commitments must be addressed in the budget section of the proposal. Applicants should note that although the exact level of the

commitment is not specified in the RFP, in previous years the Board has adopted the recommendations of the final review panel that very specific matching requirements be made as conditions of funding by the Board.
