Michael Khonsari has received verbal notification that NSF will fund the proposed Gulf Oil Spill Research Conference. BP has not indicated definitively if it will provide supplementary funding. Under these circumstances we are beginning to work on conference planning. The proposal to be funded by NSF contains several general commitments:

- Hosting of a scientific research conference in New Orleans, LA, during October-November 2010
- Participation of all three Gulf Coast EPSCoR states Louisiana, Mississippi, and Alabama in conference planning and activities
- Appointment of a Steering Committee comprised of selected Vice-Presidents/Vice-Chancellors for Research or their designees, Board of Regents staff, and representatives from Mississippi and Alabama, to determine conference topics, agenda, invited speakers, panel members, and location/date
- Leveraging of prior conferences, symposia, forums, and other oil spillrelated events
- Development of published proceedings, to be compiled from session summaries provided by conference speakers and panel members
